Family Preparedness Training for emergencies in your family home, or Community Emergency Response Training (CERT), is scheduled for Sunday, October 8, between 3:00 and 5:00PM. Community Emergency Response Team, Christ's Church has been asked to sponsor this CERT training to help prepare for natural disasters, like the floods in Texas or the anticipated big earthquake in Oregon. A full CERT, which is short for Community Emergency Response Team, training involves many hours and some rather technical skills such as fire fighting and triaging victims of a disaster.

The training at Christ's Church will be focused on how individual families can prepare for emergencies. Actions such as storing some water and certain foods, maintaining communication, learning how to support and help each other, and how to get your home and vehicles ready when services may not be available for weeks.

**IHN Hospitality Week** (International Hospitality Network) is coming up on Oct. 29 – Nov 5! Be prepared as you can.

Ephesians 6:7 And work with a smile on your face, always keeping in mind that no matter who happens to be giving the orders, you're really serving God.

Let's face it, your church hosting Interfaith Hospitality Network can look like a lot of work! Signing up volunteers, setting up church space, making the meals, serving the meals, cleaning up the meals and then being sure the volunteers show up. I felt tired and stressed just thinking about that! I'm always extremely thankful that our model encourages many volunteers and that each congregation is able to engage so many of their members.

We all want things to go well when the guests head to our church. There is one factor that will make or break the week, for both the guests and your volunteers: attitude. If there are people on your hosting team that view their work as drudgery, it can make for an extremely long week for everyone involved. As leaders, we have the opportunity to set our hosting week up to be a joyful and welcoming experience. Here are a few tips for setting your week up to be positive and memorable!

**Smile** – Even if you haven't had a great day, smile! The look on your face can quickly change the atmosphere. This can be an easy task for some, for others it can take some work. One of my friends has a harder time and will force himself to smile 5 min straight before he walks into a dreaded meeting. If you've had a tough day before your hosting duties start, maybe listen to a favorite song or reminisce on a fun memory to get yourself pumped up.

**Games and Toys** – I'm 38 years old and I still get excited to play games with my family and friends. Kids love indoor or outdoor scavenger hunts, active games in the gym or board games that everyone can play together. Not everyone will always want to participate, but focus on those who do and have a great time with them. If others see what a good time you're having, they might warm up and decide they want to join!

The Right Questions – Interactions can be a bit strained as guests get to know a new environment and as volunteers get a feel for our guest families. The right questions can quickly set a tone for everyone involved. If guests have been in the program for a while, it's possible they've had to answer the same question day after day as they meet new volunteers, which can be taxing. Check out this list you want some ideas for questions and ice breaker topics that will mix things up a bit!

Good Surprises – What can you do to make the guests' week at your church special? Could you give them a surprise 'goodie basket' in the middle of the week? What about having a Sunday School class write letters to each family member? What about setting up a water balloon/squirt gun/flour fight in the church yard where it is kids vs. volunteers? Surprises can be fun, but always keep in mind the circumstances families are in. For example, if you were to arrange a squirt gun fight, you could let the parents in on the secret the night before and encourage them to bring extra clothes, or make plastic bag ponchos.


