after months of trying to find
something suitable for their family's

Those involved in the March experience that included about a dozen area churches and about five dozen volunteers and 360 volunteer hours continue to pray for the expansion of the program into Polk County to help the families without homes in this area. The plans are moving slowly at this time.


programs. Every Monday Katie and students sit at a table in the campus Werner Center to sell fair trade items such as chocolate and honey, and craft items from Guatemala.

Stewardship News

The Stewardship Team at Christ's Church has responsibility for both the physical plant and the finances of the congregation, caring for the responsibilities of both the former Finance Committee and Trustees Committee. The current members of the team are Linda Grund-Clampit, Jim Beaird-Leeper, Linda Schiermann, Dennis Busby, Sherry Pittam and Steve Moser. Also on the team are our church treasurer, Janna Moser, and our pastor, Rev. Becky Strader.

On the physical plant side, we have been working with our new pastor, Becky, to get the parsonage into shape for her as her new home. Watch for a work party for the parsonage yard soon! We are also in the process of replacing the light bulbs in the sanctuary with energy-efficient (and perhaps brighter!) LEDs. Since we live in an older building, nothing is very straightforward and there have been a couple of detours, but it will all get done!

On the finance side, things are looking pretty good. Pledges have come in as expected and we have been able to pay our bills and stay on track toward our goal of paying 50% of our UM and Presbyterian shared giving by the end of the year. We began the year with a deficit in the General Fund, which has been made up so that we are currently carrying a positive balance. Your statements for the second quarter will be mailed out to you soon.
